

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert. 





Celebrant: *The peace of the Lord be with you always.* **All: And with your Spirit.** Deacon: *Let us offer each other the sign of peace.* 


### **Lamb of God**

I ask you to come spiritually into my heart.


I embrace you as if you were already in my heart
